Life and Character Skills

21st century students will need to exhibit strong life and character skills. They will need to take initiative, learn to set goals, and plan effectively. They will also need to demonstrate strong leadership and cross-cultural skills. 21st century learners need to demonstrate the characteristics of responsible students and citizens.

At Maidu School, students are engaged in developing life and character skills in a variety of ways. Students are given many opportunities to show leadership in the classroom and at school. In the classroom many students have class jobs or responsibilities. With this sense of belonging, students have pride and ownership in their classroom. On the playground, students assist in leading and monitoring games.

This year all staff members are implementing Time To Teach in their classrooms as well as on the playground. Students are guided to determine what behavior is expected-this is called a Teach To. Since students work together to determine what is expected, they feel a personal responsibility to demonstrate this behavior. This has been very successful in the classroom.

Students in all grades participate in monthly character education all school assemblies. These assemblies focus on the following character traits: friendship, responsibility, generosity, kindness, self-discipline, honesty, cooperation, and respect.
